GREENSTONE, ON – On March 8, 2017, a former homeless youth and current entrepreneur, Joe Roberts will be pushing a shopping cart, (a symbol of chronic homelessness) through Nipigon, Ontario. The Push for Change is a 9000 km, 517 day trek across Canada to raise awareness and funds for ending youth homelessness. Greenstone OPP Community Safety Officer (CSO) Eric Corbin has organized and supervised several events across the community of Greenstone to help with this cause, successfully increasing awareness and raising funds.

On Thursday, January 26, 2017, Constable Corbin will be holding another curling bonspiel event at the Geraldton Curling Club for the grades four to eight students of the Geraldton, Nakina, and Aroland area. Students from Johnny Therrieault Memorial School in Aroland First Nation, along with the students of Nakina Public School, and Notre Dame Des Ecole in Nakina, and students from St. Joseph, Ecole Catholique St. Joseph, and B. A. Parker Public in Geraldton are still working hard to raise money for this cause.
